The National Council on Fireworks Safety encourages consumers to review all safety tips before purchasing and using fireworks. With the increased safety features of fireworks, injuries still occur. The majority are due to misuse. "Know laws, Know your fireworks; read cautionary labels, have an adult supervise, alcohol and fireworks don't mix, wear safety glasses, light one firework at a time, don't hold a firework in your hand, use outdoors in a clear area away from buildings and vehicles, never relight a dud, soak it in a bucket of water, store fireworks in a cool, dry place, always have a bucket of water or a connected hose, never carry fireworks in your pocket or shoot them into a metal or glass container, do not experiment with homemade fireworks, keep all pet and animals away from fireworks noise, be considerate of those who may be sensitive to loud noises--returning veterans may have issues."
